# **Early Years**









Here is a snapshot of some of the activities we have been doing in the Early Years over the past month.

For Understanding the World, the Penguin class (EY2) has been talking about weather and seasons. In Literacy, our focus was the letter V, and we made volcanoes using baking soda, vinegar, glitter, and food colouring. The children loved this activity, and we were happy to do it as a group with the Dolphin class.

Dolphin class (EY1) has been The exploring letter recognition through various activities, including crafts, drawing with sticks in the sand, molding letters with playdough and air dry clay, and practising handwriting skills. In Understanding the World, the Dolphin class has looked at different fairy tales and helped children understand the characters, settings, and events in these stories. # **PRIMARY: Year 6**

Year 6 students performed a musical drama about tobacco. They drew and coloured a beautiful poster depicting the world before and after tobacco. The screenplay of the story also aligned with the concept of the world before and after tobacco. Half of the children acted in the world before tobacco, while the other half portrayed the world after.
